Our newest Pinot, from the Kanzler Vineyard in the Sonoma Coast appellation is also our most concentrated. Crafted for the serious Pinot Noir drinker, this wine explodes with deep blueberry, blackberry and cherry with a round, mouth-filling intensity. Hints of dried cherry, cola & vanilla are among its many layers. The wine is bold yet elegant with supple tannins & deep structure. The 2002 Kanzler Vineyard Pinot Noir is quintessentially Sonoma Coast.

Kanzler Vineyard is located just a few miles from the Pacific Ocean, directly in the path of fog and cool air that is funneled through a natural land channel known as the Petaluma Gap. It is this cooling that allows the grapes to experience a longer maturation stage and develop strong aromatics and flavors. We typically harvest this vineyard in late October.
